In addition to our scheduled group projects, members of Club H.O.P.E. are required to earn outside hours by completing a **COMMUNITY SERVICE SCAVENGER HUNT**. In order to remain active members and for new members to be inducted, nine (9) community service hours must be accumulated. At least 5 hours must be out of school activities on the member's own time and nonpaid. Projects are the choice of the member. Use the record keeping form on the reverse of this instruction guide as we will not keep documentation for individual members. Be sure to have an *authorized person* (maximum sign-off for parent/relative is ONE hour) fill in the last column on the record sheet for verification. **At least one activity must be sponsored by our club.** The projects are to be COMMUNITY PROJECTS - **chores at home or helping a family member does not count towards outside hours!** A copy of this form will be collected at the end of the year.

Here is a list of some examples:

- Volunteer at a community agency like an animal shelter, senior center, food bank, etc.
- Donate or contribute a bag of items to a food drive, Goodwill store or women's shelter, etc. THE LOCAL FOOD BANK IS ALSO COLLECTING EMPTY EGG CARTONS
- Clean-up litter or plant something in your neighborhood, local park or other area
- Collect things for a charity like Toys for Tots, Project Bundle-up, or other such things
- Adopt an elderly neighbor and help w/ seasonal yard work, errands, household jobs or just visit.
- Spend time reading to patients at a hospital or nursing home
- Attend a charity walk-a-thon or other fund raising event sponsored by the American Heart Association, Cancer Society, United Way or any other organization
- Help out with an organization like Special Olympics
- Recycle cans or bottles and donate to a worthy cause
- Ask a teacher if you can help them with filing, stapling, etc
- Create a "kindness kit"- collect items like a paperback book, canned goods, snacks or other items you think the recipient might enjoy and give it away to someone you think needs it.
- Volunteer to help out at the Elementary Center with the primary students during a study hall (see Mr. Cross in the office for information)
- Help w/ the diabetes walk - check w/ Mrs. Marietta (school nurse) for more info
